Subj: ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY STATEMENT

- 1. - 3. We are committed to the following practices for responsible environmental stewardship:
 - a. Be environmentally conscious neighbors and strive to protect the environment and public health and safety.

- c. Proactively manage all environmental programs, including improving energy efficiency and water quality and conservation.
